CORRECTIONS OUTREACH SUB COMMITTEE

In my very early sobriety I was asked to be a part of taking an AA meeting to the women in prison at Oakalla in Burnaby. I believe that agreeing to do that had a major effect on my ability to stay in AA. It was a commitment and then became a source of satisfaction that I could carry out this commitment. I did not do it for that long but in doing so I had to learn about Steps 1 to 3 for several months. I was being helped and of course did not know it then. There were a couple of women from that time, which remain in my memories, mostly because their stories and journeys were of great help to me and they hugely impressed me with their courage.

After several years I returned to the Corrections Committee when I learned that there was no one at Intergroup that could chair the committee. Over 2 years of chairing the committee was another rewarding satisfying effort. The thing is, in AA when we volunteer to help just a little we meet all kinds of wonderful people, because they are trying to help out just a little. Sometimes we form lasting and meaningful relationships because we share our common purpose of helping to carry our message to still suffering alcoholics.

There are two things the Committee does, help prison liaisons to take in an AA meeting to inmates and put on the Corrections Round Up once a year. Without us there can be no meetings inside for those living in prison. The committee meets once a month at Central Office, 1st Wednesday at 7:00 PM.

The Round-Up does 3 things, first we are able to have prisoners come to the Round Up. They come with AA members that have been cleared by the prison facilities to do so. Second the entire proceeds of the Round Up are used throughout the year to buy AA literature for the meetings and inmates. Thirdly, it offers an opportunity for members to gather and share experience, strength and hope with each other as we endeavor to stay sober another day.
