"The February meeting is also the annual meeting of the Intergroup. The chairperson will give a final report with recommendations for future consideration and conduct all business. An election of the Intergroup officers will occur. Following the election of Intergroup officers, six members of the Operating Committee will be elected."

"Except for election of Intergroup Officers, any active member of A.A., who meets the eligibility requirements, may volunteer to serve or may nominate any other eligible member for election to the Operating Committee. A nomination does not require a "second". Nominees must agree to accept nomination. Once nominations have been closed, a brief service history of each nominee will be given. Ballots will then be distributed to voting members, provided there are more nominees than positions to be filled. Candidates receiving the most votes will be declared elected. When the result is not clear due to a tie, a second vote will be taken between the tied candidates. In the event of a second tie, a name will be drawn from "the hat"."

of the Corrections Subcommittee. Corrections meets the 1st Friday of the month at Central Office 7:00 PM. We take AA meetings into the provincial prisons in our Intergroup area. There are 4 separate institutions, in Maple Ridge, Surrey and Coquitlam. Plus, Youth Detention centre in Burnaby. The prisons keep the population in separate pods, so we cannot have one general meeting, we need to have enough people to go into all pods. The people inside provincial prisons are serving less than 2 years. Their crimes are almost 99% related to alcohol and drugs. Many of them are in a revolving door, but if they can get sober, they do not go back to jail. We can actually give them hope, they get it when we talk AA.

Corrections Roundup Message:

From all of us on the 37th annual Greater Vancouver Intergroup Society's Corrections Roundup Committee, thank you to the volunteers who showed up on November 16th to help make this year such a huge success once again. Thank you to those groups and individual members who donated tickets – we had 10 members from inside the walls in attendance, as well as another 20 currently living in recovery homes. Every one of them appreciated the opportunity and enjoyed the fellowship and the speakers. 200 tickets were sold and a total of 163 people registered to share in panel presentations, call up meeting and speaker sharing, followed with an ice cream social. Our gross income was \$7500. leaving a surplus of approx. \$5600.

In addition to raising funds to pay for A.A. literature for those incarcerated, the Roundup is also an opportunity to encourage "outside" members to meet members currently serving time in the Provincial Institutions locally and to consider serving as sponsors for meetings inside and/or Bridging the Gap contacts.

Several years ago, those institutions moved from Burnaby & Vancouver to Surrey & Maple Ridge. As many of you know, next year the Roundup will be moving closer to the institutions we serve. Posters will be circulated in the new year and we hope to have a huge turnout and your continued support both financially and physically.
