Corrections Roundup:

In the mid 1980's a group of enthusiastic sponsors taking meetings into the local Provincial Correction centres decided to organize a fund raiser with the purpose of buying A.A. literature to bring inside those centres and distribute to interested AA meeting participants and to encourage members to consider sponsoring meetings inside. The first round up was held at St. Mary's High School in North Vancouver and the speakers were from Prince Albert, Sk. – members who were actively involved with bringing our message inside and a "lifer" who sobered up inside and was finally granted parole.

The response was heartening and thus was born the annual event which came to be known as the Corrections Round up. The Corrections Sub Committee was given the responsibility to find a chair person and approve the signing officers of that group. Initially the funds were managed by the Central Office staff, but it was soon realized the committee had to have access to the funds to pay expenses as the planning and happening evolved. Things like site rent, payment for printing, speaker expenses, decorating & registration supplies, etc.

It was also agreed to ask groups within the GVIS to donate funds for supply of tickets to those held inside – both incarcerated and in local residential treatment houses. Over the past decades the event has managed to raise sufficient funds to

cover literature costs for distribution to ARCC (through its many name changes), Surrey Pretrial, North Fraser Pretrial, Fraser Regional Corrections and the Youth Detention Centre. Experience has also shown that interest in participating in those centres increases during the day.

As with everything, the pandemic has necessitated cancellation of the Corrections Roundup, but now, with the gradual return to our normal lives, the Corrections Roundup Committee from 2 years ago has re-formed and the next event will be held November 5, 2022 from 9:30 am to 9:30 pm at the Pitt Meadows Heritage Hall, 12460 Harris Road, Pitt Meadows, BC. Tickets are available at the office, at meetings around the region or online with E-transfer ability. Once again groups are invited to help sponsor the participation of those struggling newcomers from inside facilities. Of course, groups are also asked to make the announcements so that we once again become the event not to be missed! See you November 5th!

We are now a <u>hybrid meeting</u>, with a handful of people online, and 30-50 in person. Ours is still a group that embraces laughter, and yet we enjoy solid long-term recovery messages from members and a continual focus on the newcomer.




